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- ### SPECIFIC OBJECTIVES
- Raising awareness on renewable energies (RE), energy saving measures and climate resilience in remote communities
 - Providing access to renewable energy and RE services for remote schools and communities for rural development and livelihood
 - Increasing employment opportunities for the Filipino youth through raised education and vocational training levels

- ### ESTIMATED RESULTS
- Awareness** 500 Rural households, 15 communities, 15 LGUs, 3 electrical cooperatives and 40 MSMEs have increased their knowledge on RE solutions, climate change adaptation and mitigation
 - Electricity** 16 Off-grid public schools have improved the quality of their education through the use of electricity generated by renewable energy
 - Livelihood** 15 communities have developed the livelihoods of their poor and marginalized population with access to supplementary electricity
 - MSME** 30 MSMEs have increased the use of RE, energy saving and energy efficiency measures to improve their competitiveness
 - VET** 500 EIM graduates have acquired additional qualification and certification in solar installation and maintenance resulting in increased job opportunities

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
