VIVANT ENERGY SECURES 15-YEAR PSA TO MEET SIQUIJOR'S GROWING POWER DEMAND

Vivant Energy, the power arm of Cebu-based conglomerate Vivant Corporation, has officially secured a 15-year Power Supply Agreement (PSA) to provide additional dependable electricity source for the island's growing energy demand.

The agreement, signed on 30 December follows a successful Competitive Selection Process (CSP) conducted by the Province of Siquijor Electric Cooperative (PROSIELCO). Under the deal, Vivant Energy contracted a total of 11 megawatts of capacity from its diesel power plant in Barangay Bogo, Maria, Siquijor and will supply power to the following municipalities: Larena, Lazi, Maria, San Jaun, Enrique Villanueva and Siquijor.

For PROSIELCO, the partnership marks a critical turning point for the island. PROSIELCO General Manager Glenn Galvan said. "We are excited about this partnership and we are hopeful that upon completion of the power plant, households and businesses will gain access to stable and dependable electricity." she added.

As one of the Philippines' emerging tourism destinations, Siquijor's access to reliable electricity is critical to sustaining economic growth and improving quality of life for its residents. Siquijor led the Negros Island Region in GDP growth in 2024 (7.9%), reaching P13.78 billion, up from P12.77 billion in 2023.

"It has long been Vivant Energy's thrust to prioritize areas that are largely underserved," said Vivant Energy Vice President for Off Grid Solutions Eric Omamalin. "We believe progress starts where the grid ends. Beyond building a business, Vivant is helping build communities by delivering sustainable solutions that improve everyday living."

Through partnerships that deliver durable and long-term solutions, Vivant continues to play a role in ensuring that progress reaches communities where it matters most.

The Province of Siquijor was placed under a state of calamity in June 2025 and at the height of the crisis, residents and businesses endured outages lasting up to 20 hours a day, crippling the island's tourism industry and essential services. The situation was so dire it was highlighted by President Ferdinand Marcos Jr. in his recent State of the Nation Address, where he called for urgent private-sector intervention to help address the chronic power shortages.
